

Language Grading – Hints & Tips

- **Be clear and concise** keep sentences short and focused.
- **Speak slowly** but naturally (not too slow or patronising).
- Avoid idioms, slang, and local expressions they don't translate well.
- Break information into chunks one step at a time.
- Use visuals, gestures, or demos to support meaning.
- Highlight the crucial part of your instruction what must be done first/most importantly.
- Pause and repeat key information where needed.
- **Use specialist language carefully** it's fine, but make sure it's explained or supported if essential.
- Check understanding effectively:
 - Ask people to repeat back the instruction.
 - o Offer to re-explain more slowly.
 - Ask if any words were unclear.
 - Use images or translation tools if helpful.
- Invite clarification kindly create space for questions without pressure.
- Assume nothing don't rely on implied knowledge, abbreviations, or cultural shortcuts. People also live with invisible disabilities or accessibility barriers.
- Choose layout carefully in writing use bullets, spacing, or numbering instead of long blocks of text.
- Stay calm, friendly, and patient tone and body language make a big difference.
